M.R.A. Will Outfight Cominform

The results of the Moral Rearmament campaign in South Africa had been a better understanding between the Chamber of Mines and the leaders of the mine workers unions, said Mr. W. Williams, a member of the Moral Rearmament International team, when he spoke at the Toc H Lunch Forum in Durban yesterday.

M.R.A. was an ideology of team work—not for those who could work together — but for those whose ideas clashed. The fight was to find out what was right, not who was right, he said.

If every country adopted its principles, there would be a major change and already in the Ruhr 25 per cent. of the Communist vote had been lost through the M.R.A. campaign.

A third of the world, Mr. Williams continued, was possible between Democracy and Communism and the deciding factor which would sway the decision might be M.R.A. which was presenting an ideology to outfight the advance of the Cominform menace.
