THE PRESENCE OF MR. E. R. VAN RENSBURG, the organising secretary of the South African Mine-workers' Union, with the South African delegation who have left for Caux, in Switzerland, where they will attend the Moral Re-armament World Assembly, falls in line with the Assembly's policy this year. They lay emphasis on the fact that the 1,200 Buchmanites will include a strong contingent of trades union leaders. From Britain, for instance, some of the most powerful trade unions have sent delegates.

At Caux they will tell each other that Buchmanism can overcome Communism, end war, and establish industrial peace and contentment.

The three-month world assembly in Switzerland is bigger than ever. When it ends next month 11,000 delegates will have attended.

Common Factor
