LEADERS OF CHINA SUPPORT MORAL REARMAMENT

Mr. Buchman Invited To Their Country

Riverside (California), Monday.

The President of China, Marshal Chiang Kai-Shek, 'and Madame Kai-Shek, have pledged their full support to Mr. Frank Buchman, the leader of moral rearmament.

Delivering this message at the world assembly for moral rearmament here, China's Vice-President, Dr. Chien Liefu, invited Mr. Buchman to China next year for the 2,500th anniversary of the birth of Confucius.

A member of the British delegation to the United Nations, Mr. A. R. K. Mackenzie, said the Foreign Minister of Pakistan, Sir Zafrullah Kahn, and Mrs. Pandit, sister of the Prime Minister of India, Pandit Nehru, had got together for the first time on the basis of moral rearmament after a showing of the film, "The Good Road," in New York.

The head of the Japanese delegation and former Ambassador to Washington, Mr. Kensuki Horinouchi, described moral rearmament as a spiritual dynamic which Japan needed to make democracy work.

Mr. Horinouchi said: "I ask for forgiveness for the wrong we have done. We are determined to devote ourselves to the work of remaking the world and to-day we are bound in the common fight for the God-inspired ideology of democracy."—Sapa-Reuter.
