## Inter-racial conference advocated

Two full-time workers for Moral Re-Armament told a Toc H lunch forum in Durban to-day that an inter-racial conference on the highest level would do much to remove fear and misunderstanding in South Africa.

The two workers, Mr. J. Mallory, an Englishman, and Mr. E. Lutke, a German, had given examples of how Moral Re-Armament had changed the lives and outlook of those who accepted its aims. They were then asked by a questioner: "How does Moral Re-Armament hope to have influence in South Africa, where all social mixing between races is officially discouraged?"

Mr. Mallory said he and his colleagues met non-Europeans on an ideological basis. "Ours is an ideology at work, not a new liberalism," he added.
