Ills of World Discussed

Moral Rearmament Conference

Caux (Switzerland), Thursday.

Dr. W. Nicol (Administrator of the Transvaal), speaking at the World Assembly for Moral Rearmament at Caux, Switzerland, referred to the deep-rooted differences of colour and of the standpoint in South Africa.

He added: "I realize that we require an overarching ideology."

Accompanying Dr. Nicol are four members of the Executive Committee of the Transvaal including Dr. Wassenaar, leader of the Nationalist Party in the Provincial Council.

Addressing the assembly's 1,200 delegates, Dr. Wassenaar said:

"Here in Caux we have seen a world of diversity in unity, and we have seen unity in diversity. We have just heard that 'everything has got to change,' and that is true. This is the hope for a new and better world."

KRUGER'S LAST HOME

Dr. Wassenaer recalled that Paul Kruger's last home was at Clarens—which can be seen from Caux—and thanked the Swiss people for the way they had cared for the old President in the last years of his life.

Speaking subsequently to Press representatives, Dr. Nicol said he was convinced that Caux had a solution for the present-day problem of the world. A common loyalty to an overarching ideology was being put into practice, and that appeared to be the reply to division, strife and

materialism.
