On their arrival in South Africa they were received by General Smuts at Groote Schuur and by the Governor-General at Westbrooke. Cape Town accorded them a civic reception. Since then they have carried their message to all sections of the life of this and other cities.

Speaking of their impressions of the trip, Mr. Hofmeyr said: "Throughout the length and breadth of this great country there are countless people who learned certain simple, basic truths from the Oxford Group—the need for absolute moral standards, that human nature can be changed, that teamwork is an essential part of Christian life, and that God's guidance can be the normal experience of all who want to find it.
