THE moral rearmament movement claims that trade union leaders from Britain, the United States, Sweden, Africa and India have repudiated the recent attack on the movement by the International Confederation of Free Trade Unions, to which they are affiliated.

The I.C.F.T.U. condemned Moral Rearmament, led by Dr. Frank Buchman, for "following the path of a dictatorship." A cable from the Moral Rearmament world conference in Caux-sur-Montreaux, Switzerland, states that Mr. James Haworth, president of the British Transport Salaried Staffs Association, said the I.C.F.T.U. report misrepresented the facts and its implications were "untimely, unjust and untrue." Mr. Axel Strand, president of the Swedish Trades Union Congress, and Mr. Sibnath Banerjee, president of the 800,000-strong Indian Socialist Trade Union, are also reported to have protested against the I.C.F.T.U. attack.
