Kenya hatred  
of S. Africa  
noticed

EVERYWHERE she went in Kenya she noticed hatred towards South Africa, Mrs. Adriaan Smuts, of Johannesburg, who has just returned from East Africa, told a Moral Re-armament gathering in the city yesterday.

Mrs. Smuts said the great mass of Natives were eager to grasp new ideas. They would be recruits for Communism or for Moral Re-armament.

Without the latter there would be no place for White people in South Africa, she had been told by the editor of the "Bantu Mirror."

Mr. Leon Sapire, an attorney who served with the International Brigade during the Spanish Civil War, said yesterday that Africa had a definite part in the Comintern plans.

COMMUNIST PLANS

"Their plan is peace in Europe, war in the East and preparation in Africa," Mr. Sapire said. "The leaders realize that the 150-million non-Europeans in Africa must play a tremendous part in the world of tomorrow. That is why they are bringing to them their ideology of materialism and class warfare. The aim is to wipe out the White man."

One day, he said, there would be a federation of States that would stretch like a black belt across Africa. Did one have to wait for Communism to capture them? The counter was Moral Re-armament, which taught all to work together under the guidance of God.
