"Even the British Minister could not save me, and off I was packed into Germany, the Nazis taking great care to arrest me officially at Flensburg, on the other side of the Danish border.

"In five years I was in nine concentration camps and hospitals.

"Every month for the first six months I was questioned by the Gestano, who tried to extract information from me about certain people in the Scandinavian countries, but I was never ill-treated.

"However, a diet of 800 calories a day undermined my health and I developed a mastoid. By luck

IR ANDREW STRANG, 2 a professor, who I found out aftermember of the moral re- wards was pro-British, performed the operation and made an excellent job of it.

"In the different camps I worked to raise the morale of the inmates. Within nine months in one camp I had courses going in 43 different subjects, and about 30 men wrote their matric and a number their B.A.

"In entertainment we started with a mouth-organ and finished with a decent orchestra and fullscale plays.

"One of the greatest moraleraisers was escaping. Even the mass punishments that efollowed could not undo the good that was caused by a couple getting away over the wire."
