TO ATTEND MORAL RE-ARMAMENT WORLD ASSEMBLY

Johannesburg September 5. PARLIAMENTARY delegation, respresenting the three major parties in the South African Houses of Assembly, left Palmietfontein by air this morning to attend the Moral Re. Armament World Assembly at Caux-sur-Montreux, Switzerland. The names of the delegates are Mr. H. J. Klopper (H.N.P., Vredefort), Mr. J. S. Labuschagne (A.P., Klip River). Mr. F. W. Waring (U.P., Orange Grove) and Mrs. Waring. With them in the delegation is Mr. E. R. van Rensburg, Organising Secretary of the South African Mineworkers' Union.

Mr. van Rensburg is the third representative of the Mineworkers' Union to attend the Moral Re-Armament Assembly this year. The others have been Mr. Visser and Mr. R. P. Erasmus, President of the Mine workers' Union.

The purpose of the Assembly, which has been attended this year by parliamentary and industrial groups from fifty-two nations, has been announced as "to laarn the secret and hear the evidence of a positive ideology at work uniting and remaking the world."

"In a critical hour for mankind," the invitation continues, "Caux demonstrates an overarching ideology for East and West, for Left and Right, for management and labour."

Other members of the South African Parliament who hope to attend the Caux Assembly while in Europe this summer include the Speaker, the Hon. J. F. T. Naude, and Mr. A. W. S. Mortifee (U.P., Zululand).
