

LEADERS WITHOUT VANITY NEEDED

MEN WHO wanted self-glorification and anything that would help them personally instead of the country or the world were not the type of leaders who were needed, said Dr Elliott Gabellah, vice-president of the African National Council, in Salisbury yesterday.

Addressing a Moral Re-Armament international assembly yesterday at the University of Rhodesia on the theme: Africa — The Answer Continent, Dr Gabellah said if people listened to God they would get positive answers.

"Rhodesia is a beautiful country with problems. These will not be solved by man with his theories and strategy," said Dr Gabellah.

DISTRUST

"In the world and in this country we live under great strain and fear. The black man fears the white man and the white man fears and distrusts the black man. But we want men who will listen to God and move without fear. Then we will have the answer."

Dr Gabellah brought greetings from Bishop Abel Muzorewa, president of the ANC, who wished the conference every success.

About 300 people attended including visitors from 20 countries in Africa and elsewhere.
