CONRAD HUNTE, the famous West Indian batsman — he played in 44 Tests and hit eight centuries — said his dream was a non-racial classless society and that he would continue to strive for the removal of the partitions which existed between racial groups.

Mr Hunte, a member of the Moral Rearmament Group, who is visiting South Africa, preached at St Columba's Church, Parkview, Johannesburg, at the weekend. He said his dreams were that society's standard would be that of merit, that education would become service, not status, and that industry would partner government, capital and labour in the reconstruction of society.
