CAUX SUR MONTREUX. MRS' MARIE VAN SELM, of Pretoria, a member of one of South Africa's oldest families, and Mrs. Bode Thomas, wife' of the Transport Minister of Nigeria, received a standing ovation as they pledged themselves to fight together for unity in Africa at the world assembly for Moral Rearmament here to-day.

Mrs. van Selm said that it was in Nigeria, in the home of Mrs. Thomas, that she had found the answer to her bitter racial feeling: "For years bitterness, creed and fear have divided Africa. Moral Rearmament has provided unity above race, class and colour — one platform on which all can meet," she said.

Turning to Mrs. Thomas, Mrs. van Selm apologised for hersuperior attitude as a European towards Africans. She said she would donate her inheritance of two farms and a plantation to the work of Moral Rearmament to build the new Africa.
