

'Forgotten Factor' as film

Moral Rearmament's play, "The Forgotten Factor", has been filmed and will be shown in the Union shortly.

This was confirmed today by Major Stephen Foot, of Johannesburg, who was present at the showing of the film "An Idea Takes Wings" to delegates at the conference of the Federation of Master Bakers and Confectioners of South Africa in Port Elizabeth this week.

Another film, "Jotham Valley," illustrating the principles of Moral Rearmament, was due in South Africa shortly, Major Foot said.

Reviewing briefly the progress of Moral Rearmament in Africa, Major Foot drew attention to the successful termination of the London Conference on the new Nigerian constitution.

Major Foot said it was largely due to Dr. Nnamdi Azikiwe, who represented the National Council of Nigeria and the Cameroons at the conference, that the deliberations were successful.

Dr. Azikiwe, he said, had attended the world assembly for Moral Rearmament at Caux in Switzerland four years ago. At the end of his visit he had said with conviction: "It is not a question of whether Nigeria or Britain is right, but what is right for Nigeria."

Major Foot said the principles of Moral Rearmament were being followed by many African and European leaders and, in many cases, was softening the bitter nationalistic ideas that were sweeping through Africa.
