MRA CHANGED WHITES' VIEW OF KENYATTA

THE opinion that white people in Kenya have of Jomo Kenyatta has changed radically in the last two years, a Que Que audience was told by Mr. Bremer Hofmeyr, leader of the Moral Re-Armament movement in Southern Africa.

Two years ago, he said, they were saying: "God help us if Kenyatta gets into power." But now they were saying: "God help us if that man dies."

Mr. Hofmeyr was speaking to the large audience which attended the showing of the film, *The Crowning Achievement*, at the invitation of St. Stephen's Church.

He said the change had come about through Mr. Kenyatta's acceptance of the ideology of MRA and his determination to wipe out all hatred and bitterness and prejudice.

Mr. and Mrs. Hofmeyr formerly lived in Kenya and Mrs. Hofmeyr's father was buried alive as a human sacrifice by the Mau Mau.

Both said that without a revolutionary change in the white people, all Africa will suffer from warfare more horrible than that experienced in Kenya.

Play by African

The Crowning Achievement and Freedom were shown in various halls here and attracted excellent audiences. The former was brought back by popular request.

Freedom is based on a play written by an African and deals with the struggle of the masses in an African country to throw off the yoke of the colonial powers.

This impressive film was made in Nigeria by Rickard Tegstrom, Walt Disney's chief cameraman.

Those taking part were not professional actors but people like Dr. William Nkomo, of Pretoria, who have accepted the ideology of MRA.
