MORAL RE-ARMA-MENT

Caux-Motreux, Switzerland, August 4.—A Cable message from New World News Agency states, the cast which toured South Africa with the Moral Re-Armaplay "The Forgotten Factor" was chosen to present it here this weekend at the opening session of the sixth World Assembly for Moral Re-Armament.

Amongst the 1,000 delegates from 32 nations were representatives from the Sudan, Kenya, Uganda and South Africa. Strong industrial delegations came from the docks and mines of Britsin as well as from the heavy industries of France and Italy.

A Berlin student leader, Heinz Kreig, spoke for the youth of Eastern Germany who seek an alternative road to that which today is leading thousands to Berlin's Communist Youth Rally. "German youth will not respond to propaganda from the West based on a negative philosophy of anti-Communism. They will rise and respond to the moral challenge of Moral Rs-We are determined Armament. to follow this new path." Kreig stated that a German translation of "The World ReBuilt," a new book on Moral Re-Armament by Peter Howard, had been sent to German University 152,000 students on both sides of the iron Curtain.

Mr. Peter Howard, who r.sided at the opening session of the Assembly, said, "many think Communism is the answer. Perhaps they are both wrong. The root problem is the selfishness of all of us which makes social injustice and war possible. The answer is an idea which changes everyone everywhere."
