Industry a 'common ground'

CAUX, Switzerland.—A moral rearmament conference was told here yesterday that Black and White people working in industry could save the Rhodesian situation because industry was still a common ground where the two races met.

Caleb Somkence, African public relations officer for Lever Brothers, in Salisbury, said: "Rhodesia is at war over material goods. We are worshipping the goods made in the factories. We should try worshipping God in the factories."

He claimed that Rhodesia could be a key to the future of the whole African continent, but that "imported ideas had not worked because they were not based on a change in man". — Sapa-Reuter.
