A correspondent who attended the Oxford House Party sends us a short account of a memorable fortnight. "Knights, clerks, students, Bishops, journalists, teachers, clergymen; visitors from Germany, Chile, France, South Africa, America, Spain—all met here to share a common experience, to learn, often for the first time, the secret of victorious living. . . . The culminating point of this House Party came with the service held at 5 p.m. on the evening of Sunday, July 3. One hundred and fifty young men and women were commissioned for service during the next few weeks as traveling teams of evangelists. They will tour the whole country filled with one common purpose, to capture men and women for Christ. Another team of workers is going straight to Geneva, and plans are being formed for a further campaign in America."
