# Travelling Is Their Way Of Life

**I**N Durban for a very short stay are Group Captain Pat Foss, O.B.E., and Mrs. Foss, prominent members of the Moral Rearmament group. They arrived in Durban on Sunday and are staying with Canon Hayward Harris until Thursday, when they sail in the Thorshall for Kenya.

Suitcases have played, and will continue to play, a most important part in the lives of this couple, who were married seven months ago. Their mission is a roving one. After a distinguished career in the Royal Air Force during the war, Group Captain Foss came to the Union in 1947; he flew all the way in a Proctor light aircraft from England to the Cape. Mrs. Foss came out two years later with the play "The Forgotten Factor," which toured the country.

## Periodic Return

Life has been no more settled since their marriage, for after spending time in most parts of the Union they are now going to trouble-scarred Kenya. They cannot even be certain just how long their stay there will be.

Periodically, as do all full-time workers for Moral Rearmament, Group Captain and Mrs. Foss return to the international headquarters of the movement at Caux, in Switzerland. Their most recent visit was during August and September of last year.

## From St. Gallen

Travelling with them in the Thorshall will be one Danish and two Swiss fellow-workers, one of them Miss Madi Hegetschweiler, of St. Gallen. Away from her home and family, her acceptance of the inevitable "packing and following" is as cheerful as that of Group Captain and Mrs. Foss.

"After all," Mrs. Foss reasoned, "we have chosen to do it because we believe in it, so we do it without worrying."
