CRISIS FACING THE WORLD

Need for Moral Rearmament

The Governor-General, the Rt. Hon. G. Brand van Zyl, and Mrs. van Zyl, the President of the Senate (Senator C. A. van Niekerk), the Speaker of the House of Assembly (Mr. J. F. T. Naude), and several Cabinet Ministers were among those who attended the presentation by the Moral Rearmament Group of "The Forgotten Factor" in the Hofmeyr Hall last night.

Senator van Niekerk, addressing the audience at the end of the performance, said the world was now facing a great crisis. An evil ideology which encouraged dishonesty, impurity and hatred was fighting for control in every country.

Moral rearmament could help every nation to restore "the spiritual backbone" of democracy, and whether it succeeded or failed in this would affect world peace in the future.
